EYFS	In Early Years understanding the world through History is an important part of our curriculum. 'Understanding the World' encompasses a range of early historical skills and knowledge in Early Years. Children are encouraged to develop a sense of change over time and are given opportunities to differentiate between past and present by observing routines throughout the day, growing plants, observing the passing of seasons and time and looking at photographs of their life and of others.
